Newsletter - July 1987.

Dear Members,

The purpose of this newsletter is to up-date you on the progress of the newly formed Association and to inform you of the many topics raised by the members when completing their application forms.

Firstly, the Rules of the Association have been vetted by your Committee and formally adopted at the meeting on July 6th. I am trying to arrange for copies of the Rules to be supplied to every member; any amendments that you deem necessary can be dealt with at the A.G.M.

To date, some 125 households have joined the Association. Some potential members have indicated that they have delayed joining until they are sure that it will be a going concern. If the enthusiasm of your Committee and their initial hard work is anything to go by, we should go from strength to strength. Currently, members of the Committee are calling at the residences of non-members of the Association, in order that we can achieve a membership in excess of 50% of the dwellings on East Broyle.

The topics of interest and concern to members cover a gamut far too broad to itemise in this newsletter (See Appendix) but it is clear that the areas of . Principal concern are:

1. The pro's and con's of the junction round-about at the entrance of the estate. The membership seem divided on this matter as are, indeed, the Committee. Since we wish to represent the views of the majority, your additional comments are of value.
2. The need to ensure that Norwich Road remains a "no through-road".
3. Requests for the control of dogs and their fouling of the Play-green.

Some members have asked that a more local hall be found as a venue for general meetings and social gatherings. Your Committee have written to the Head-masters of the two junior schools in St. Paul's Road to ask if a hall could be hired for an evening: we await their replies.

Now to report on actions taken by your Committee:

Letters have been sent to the local Police regarding the dangerous parking at 3:00 p:m on week-days at the junction of Norwich and Worcester Roads outside the junior school. Action by the local Constable and the Head-master has certainly improved matters - but for how long?

A request for representation on the Goodwood Airport Consultative Committee was made but the reply, with which we are not satisfied, informs us that the Airfield Committee is for "Villages and Parishes that abut onto the airfield perimeter and are affected by agreed flight paths". Whilst it may be true that we do not directly abut, we are certainly in the flight path at week-ends!

A letter has been forwarded to the W.S.C.C. asking that a "No Through Road" sign be erected in Norwich Road in an attempt to prevent the coaches, lorries and cars reversing from the dead-end of Norwich Road which have been seen in recent weeks

A statement of objection has been sent to the District Council in response to a second application for planning permission to extend the flank garden of a house in Exeter Road.

Finally, a letter of thanks was sent to Chichester District Council regarding the imposition of a Tree Preservation Order on the mature Oak trees at the rear of the Broyle Road and Carlisle Gardens. Planning/Development activity on the land in question seems to be in remission - again, for the moment!
